SUMMARY OF SERVICES:

Provides opportunities for individuals with disabilities to work and lead productive and independent lives. To begin the vocational rehabilitation process, you will need to:

- 1. Call our office to schedule an appointment to attend orientation.
- 2. Client will be scheduled for orientation (in person or Zoom). Client will also be told what to bring to orientation.
- 3. During orientation, all services that ARS provides, will be discussed.
- 4. Once Client has attended orientation, client is then referred to a counselor.
- 5. Counselor or admin will contact client to schedule intake appointment with counselor.

At the appointment, you will meet with a vocational counselor who will start the process of determining if you are eligible for services. The applicant is usually determined eligible or ineligible within 60 days. A person is eligible if he/she has a disability and requires vocational rehabilitation services to prepare for, secure, retain, or regain employment.

SUMMARY OF SERVICES:

Serving a county of over 604 square miles (11 square miles of which is water) and a population of nearly 37,000, the Sheriff's Office is responsible for primary law enforcement services of the unincorporated area and the cities of Alpena, Bellefonte, Bergman, Diamond City, Everton, Harrison, Lead Hill, Olvey, Omaha, South Lead Hill, Valley Springs and Zinc. These law enforcement services are provided by personnel in the Patrol Division, Criminal Investigation Division, Support Services Division and Jail Operations Division.

Children who are in need of a medical exam are seen by a specialized Forensic Pediatric Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner in a child friendly environment onsite at the children's advocacy center.

The children's advocacy center provides education regarding child abuse awareness and prevention to schools, churches, businesses, and other community organizations.
